January 1960 – The Greater Winnipeg Sanitary District levy is \$1,472 for 1960

January 1960 – The official opening of the addition to Princess Margret School is to be held January 27, 1960

January 1960 – The Rev. E. Rudachuk tells Mayor Dickson that a Ukrainian Catholic Church will be built in North Kildonan at some time in the future

January 1960 – Constable V. Brown resigns as of February 15, 1960

January 1960 – A Municipal By-law is amended to allow cigarette and ball point vending machines to be installed in North Kildonan.

January 1960 – Edison is to be paved east of Rothesay.

January 1960 – Forty-three acres in the southeast corner of North Kildonan is sold to the Arcadian Company for \$25,000.00, the land is to be zoned industrial.

January 1960 – Police salaries are increased by \$30.00 per month for all ranks as this is the first ever agreement with the newly formed North Kildonan Police Association

January 1960 – The Hawthorne Street Pumping Station is under construction.

February 1960 – Mark Pearce Place is to be renamed Cedarcrest Drive.

February 1960 – A service station owned by H. J. Epp is approved for the corner of McLeod and Gateway.

February 1960 – Apartment blocks for 223 and 271 Edison are to be approved.

February 1960 – North Kildonan School Board obtains title to the land for the new school in the Springfield Heights area for \$10,000 (Springfield Heights School) February 1960 – Constable V. Brown is given an extra six months probationary period on the Police Department so his resignation is rescinded

February 1960 – East Kildonan is asked for its approval to extend the boundaries of the North Kildonan water system

March 1960 – Mr. Copp and Mr. Magus ask for permission to install gas pumps adjacent to their snack bar and vegetable stand on Highway 59 (De Vries)

March 1960 – The Salvation Army receives a grant of \$50 for 1960

March 1960 – The Greater Winnipeg Transit Commission announces a surplus of \$249,000 in 1959 but indications point to a deficit for 1960. When the new Disraeli Freeway opens in May, buses will travel that way and the trolley buses on Henderson Highway will be discontinued

March 1960 – Transferred to the Machinery Replacement Saving Account are \$5,000 from surplus funds, \$1,631.89 from the Old Sewage Disposal Account and \$1,544.36 from the Sewage Construction Account.

March 1960 – Rothesay Street is to be extended north over the Bergen Cut-off (south side of Springfield Road)

March 1960 – The Kildonan-St Paul Health Unit suggests that North Kildonan ban the keeping of pigeons in Ward One or in any other built up part of the municipality

March 1960 – St. Annes's Ukrainian Catholic Church announces plans to build a new church on Douglas.

March 1960 – Land north of Edison and east of Rothesay is considered for a new residential subdivision.

March 1960 – Leo Rougeau is given permission to install gas pumps at his property at McLeod and Highway 59 (Molson)

March 1960 – A fourplex owned by Pete Penner is approved for the corner of Rothesay and McKay as well as another fourplex for 379 Edison.

March 1960 – Mr. John De Graff asks for \$500 compensation, the value of bushes and trees which are to be removed for the widening of McLeod Avenue

March 1960 – The widening of Springfield Road east of Highway 59 is completed.

March 1960 – A barbershop and an insurance office owned by Robert Richardson of 1104 Henderson Highway are approved for in front of his existing home

March 1960 – Kildonan Drive is to be paved south to Larchdale Crescent as asked by Janzen Builders Limited

March 1960 – Council tells the Police Department to have the broken down cars removed from the residence at the south corner of Hawthorne and Henderson Highway

March 1960 – Mr. Don Nightingale asks for a grant to build a proposed new Y.M.C.A. building on Melrose Avenue (Kimberly) in East Kildonan

April 1960 – Council orders the Chief of Police to terminate Constable Brown services as a police constable.

April 1960 – East Kildonan and North Kildonan take turns plugging and unplugging a culvert on McLeod east of Gateway which floods Mr. Magus's land and Mr. Archie Schultz's land destroying his flax crop in North Kildonan. East Kildonan wants it plugged so water doesn't flow into the East Kildonan sewer system causing sewer backups among its residents. North Kildonan wants it unplugged because the water is backing up, flooding farmland in North Kildonan. This dispute goes on for years and leads to court battles.

April 1960 – Mr. Charles Barry asks for tax concessions on the Firemen's Club formerly the Dutch Club on Springfield Road

April 1960 – McLeod Avenue is to be widened from the railroad tracks to Highway 59.

May 1960 – Council approves the plans of the Kildonan Canoe Club to install dock facilities to serve motorboats.

May 1960 – The Volunteer Fire Chief Jack Hoppenbrouwer is now to be paid \$25.00 per month.

May 1960 – Canadian Oil Companies Ltd is ordered to dispose of the old cars on its property at Bonner and Henderson.

May 1960 – The Public Works Staff is allowed to purchase a new truck as long as it costs less than \$1900.00.

May 1960 – A fourplex is to be built next to 349 Kingsford Avenue

May 1960 – Mr. Matt Graham is given the scavenging contract for four pickups in 1960 for \$1,000

May 1960 – Steps are to be taken to stop property owners in Ward One from burning garbage and rubbish or the dumping of garbage or rubbish in Ward One

May 1960 – River East School Division asks for permission to build a new high school on Sutton on parts of Kildonan Parish Lots 54-56

May 1960 – Mr. Lawrence Edward Klump is appointed a Justice of the Police to collect fines and costs from 9 AM to 5 PM, Monday to Friday

May 1960 – Mr. Leo Rougeau is given a building permit to erect a combination restaurant and filling station on Kildonan Parish Lot 66 at the corner of McLeod and Highway 59 (Molson)

May 1960 – Mr. Huebert is given permission to operate a pre-cast concrete plant at a location between Highway 59 (Molson) and the hydro transmission lines on Kildonan Parish Lots 78/80.

May 1960 – Part of the Rural Municipality of Springfield is to be patrolled by the North Kildonan Police in a 2-month trial basis.

May 1960 – McIvor is to be widened between the cemetery and Highway 59 (De Vries)

May 1960 – A trailor park for 50-75 trailors with utility rooms, hot dog stand, Dairy Queen etc is approved for 10 acres of land on parts of Kildonan Parish Lots 48-51 along Highway 59 and is to be zoned C2

May 1960 – An apartment block is to be built at 223 Edison Avenue

May 1960 – Bonner Avenue is to be widened between the railways tracks (North East Pioneers Greenway) and Birds Hill Road (De Vries)

May 1960 – Henderson Highway between the Municipal Office at 1400 Henderson Highway and Ferry Lane (Whellams Lane) is to be zoned a C2 Commercial District

June 1960 – Concrete sidewalks are to be constructed on the south side of Edison from Henderson to Rothesay and on the west side of Rothesay from McKay to Oakland.

June 1960 – Council asks the provincial government to make Highway 59, a 40mph Nairn Avenue to the Perimeter Road.

June 1960 – Edison is to be paved from Rothesay to Raleigh.

June 1960 – The United Church asks for an extension of Pentland to Fortier to allow access to its church property.

June 1960 – A concrete sidewalk is to be built on the north side of Edison from Rothesay to Raleigh.

June 1960 – A total of 600 cubic yards of gravel is to be placed on Raleigh from Oakland to Springfield Road

June 1960 – North Kildonan's population is now 6831, made up of Ward One 4592, Ward Two 1670, Ward Three 195, Ward Four 374. Each ward is represented by one councillor which is deemed to be unfair by a growing number of people in Ward One.

June 1960 – Calvin Christian School is to be supplied by a well instead of a watermain because of the cost of extending the watermain.

June 1960 – A Go-Kart Course is to be constructed on the east side of Birds Hill Road (Panet) on Kildonan Parish Lot 86

June 1960 - The Community Chest (United Way) is given permission to canvass in North Kildonan

June 1960 – The Cordite Ditch and the Bunn's Creek channel is to be reconstructed at a total cost of \$178,000 with North Kildonan paying 12% of the cost, the Municipality of Springfield 31% and the Town of Transcona 57%

July 1960 – The Canoe Club is given permission to hold speed boat races along their property

July 1960 – A six inch watermain is to be built to service River East Collegiate and other buildings on Sutton

July 1960 – North Kildonan United Church is given permission to move the pre-fab church building from Melrose (Kimberly) and Golspie in East Kildonan to the church property on Pentland in Ward Two

August 1960 – A duplex is approved for 415/417 Kingsford.

August 1960 – Water restrictions on the use of water for gardens and lawns are removed from those with watermains.

August 1960 – Jantzen Construction is to pave a portion of Kildonan Drive and donate land for a park in consideration for Council rezoning part of Kildonan Parish Lot 45 for a subdivision

August 1960 – Mr. K. C. Seaford is to be hired to do plumbing inspections while Mr. Van Alstyne is on holidays

August 1960 – Springfield Road is to be widened east of Highway 59 (De Vries)

August 1960 – Henderson Highway is to be taken over by Metro Winnipeg from the provincial government.

September 1960 – A new building is to be erected at the Knowles School for Boys.

September 1960 – The Chief of Police George Love receives a new service revolver for \$25.00.

September 1960 – Stalker Avenue is to be renamed Stalker Bay.

September 1960 – North Kildonan equalized assessment is now \$6,921,000.00.

September 1960 – A duplex to be built by Mr. P. H. Penner is approved for 326 Edison.

September 1960 – Mr. Don Dietz is hired as a North Kildonan Police Constable on probation

September 1960 – The Volunteer Firemen are to sell the Firemen's Club on Springfield Road and buy the 25 foot lot next to it.

September 1960 – Pentland is to be extended to service North Kildonan United Church.

September 1960 – The Knowles School for Boys is given permission to operate a dog kennel on their property.

October 2 1960 – The official opening of Springfield Heights School on Sharron Bay takes place at 8 PM.

October 1960 – A natural gas pipeline is being extended to River East Collegiate now under construction.

October 1960 – Sewer lines are being built on part of Springfield Road and Sutton but they do not extend to River East Collegiate which must rely on a large septic tank and a septic field.

October 1960 – There is a proposal to close Raleigh between Douglas and McIvor in order to reduce the cost of reconstructing Bunn's Creek but this proposal is rejected but Raleigh Street is diverted at this location

October 1960 – The North Kildonan Dental Clinic for school children is given a grant of \$235

October 1960 - Mr. L. Klump is paid \$25 for acting as the deputy returning officer for the municipal advance polls

October 1960 – The old municipal nuisance grounds on Bonner (Gateway Community Centre) may in the future be used as a recreation area as a proposal to sell the property for a tile factory is turned down

October 1960 – The Sanitary Inspector Mr. C. Van Alystyne's salary is raised to \$1,500 per year. The rate charged for the inspection of plumbing is raised to \$2.00 per fixture from \$1.50 per fixture

October 1960 – A triplex to be built by Peter Wiens between McKay and Edison

October 1960 – A concrete sidewalk is to be laid on De Fehr Street from Mark Pearce to Edison.

October 1960 – A playground is to be built on De Graff Bay.

October 1960 – A service station is approved for the northeast corner of Rothesay and Kingsford.

November 1960 – An apartment block is approved for 223 Edison.

November 1960 – Municipal election officials are paid \$15 and \$12 for the day

November 1960 – Transcona complains about Central Auto Wrecking on the North Kildonan side of King Street (Plessis) which has stored semi-trailors and wrecks being stored outside the fenced in area

November 1960 – The A. A. De Fehr Manufacturing shop on Edison is given permission to expand

November 1960 – The C.N.I.B. is given a grant of \$50

November 1960 – Litz Drive is to be extended to Henderson Highway.

December 1960 – Council guarantees that concrete pavement will be completed on the following streets by October 31 1961

December 1960 – Springfield Heights Commun10+ity Club is given permission to build a skating rink behind Springfield Heights School and to bring in a box car for skating warm up purposes

December 1960 – Mr. Robert De Groot the Pound Keeper is to be paid an additional \$25 to patrol the school grounds as well as his present duties

December 1960 – Tenders are to be advertised for the pickup of garbage in Ward One

December 1960 – A total of \$20,000 in surplus cash is to be moved to the Machinery Replacement Account

December 1960 – A letter of appreciation is sent to retiring Councillor Schwartz

January 1961 – Mayor John Dickson, Councillors, H. R. Redekopp, Leo Rougeau, P. Crook and M. Whitehead

January 1961 – Mr. Thorgierson of 590 Cathedral Avenue receives the contract for garbage pickup in Ward One at 15 cents per household per year

January 1961 – The Kildonan Canoe Club requests the use of the court room in the municipal offices at 1400 Henderson Highway for the purpose of conducting a general meeting. Permission is granted with the Canoe Club paying \$5.00 to the caretaker for cleanup after the meeting

January 1961 – North Kildonan turns over all assessment records and documents to Metro Winnipeg which is now responsible for all assessment in Metro Winnipeg

January 1961 – Councillor Redekopp asks that there be no purchase of materials from Redekopp Lumber and Supply as long as he is a member of council.

January 1961 – Dog Licenses for 1961, males \$3.00, females \$15.00. The pound fee is set at \$3.00 per day plus additional charges of 50 cents per day. It now costs \$15.00 per year for a kennel license.

January 1961 – A duplex is to be built at the corner of Edison and Roch.

February 1961 – The Roadside Store is given permission to collect water bills

February 1961 – The Salvation Army receives a grant of \$100

February 1961 – A Caterpillar Diesel Road Patrol is purchased for \$28,285

February 1961 – The 12 volunteer firefighters are to receive radios in their homes so they can be contacted faster about new fires at a cost of \$124.50 each

February 1961 – A garage with gas pumps owned by Mr. P. Holgate is to be built on the south side of Douglas Avenue facing Henderson Highway

February 27 1961 – The official opening of River East Collegiate is held at 8 PM.

March 1961 – Rothesay is to be extended north across the Bergen Cut-off.(south side of Springfield Road)

March 1961 – The Manitoba Travel and Convention Association receives a grant of \$100

March 1961 – A 10-suite apartment block is approved for Edison.

March 1961 – The A. A. De Fehr factory at 400 Edison is to be expanded.

March 1961 – A sidewalk is to be built on the north side of McKay and on the west side of Roch from Oakland to McKay.

March 1961 – North Kildonan purchases \$15,000 in Manitoba Saving Bonds which pay 5%

March 1961 – Mr. Ed Claus is given permission to operate a skeet range near the nuisance grounds for a rental fee of \$25

March 1961 – H. R. Eade is awarded the work of preparing the Electors' Roll at 20.8 cents per name

March 1961 – Council goes on record opposing any levy made by the Metro Winnipeg Council taking over any outstanding debt and debt charges of any municipality with the possible exception of the Disraeli Bridge debt

April 1961 – North Kildonan is to purchase a Wayne Crothers Model C-450 street sweeper at a cost of \$11,500

April 1961 – A kennel license is approved for Mr. D. Garry of 315 Bonner Avenue

April 1961 – A Phillips dictating machine is purchased for \$238.60

April 1961 – Matt Graham is given the scavenging contract for four pickups in Ward Two for \$1,200.

April 1961 – Litz Homes is to build a new subdivision west and north of the Municipal Offices at 1400 Henderson Highway.

April 1961 – Glen (Glenway) is to be graded and ditched from Rothesay to Raleigh. The cost of \$11,500 is to be split with East St. Paul.

April 1961 – A total of 440 feet of Westgate Avenue is to be graveled on a 50/50 basis with Transcona with each paying \$177.26

May 1961 – A subdivision is approved for land west of Rothesay and north of McKay.

May 1961 – A 16-inch watermain is to be constructed through East Kildonan to connect to the 10-inch watermain at Oakland and Henderson.

May 1961 – A concrete sidewalk is to be built on Whellams Lane.

May 1961 – The North Kildonan Community Club asks the North Kildonan School District # 2116 for a tract of land to erect a clubhouse

May 1961 – Calvin Christian School is granted exemption from property taxes on its school building but not its land

May 1961 – Samuel Blasco is awarded the contract for sidewalk construction on streets in Ward One at \$1.45 per lineal foot

May 1961 – The River East School Division purchases 11 lots for River East Collegiate for \$4,220

May 1961 – The cell in the police office in the municipal offices is to be converted to office space.

May 1961 – Raleigh is to be oiled from Edison to the south boundary at Oakland

May 1961 – The skeet range is set up north of the Cordite Ditch Road and adjacent to the North Kildonan Nuisance Grounds

May 1961 - Mr. A. De Groot is given permission to move the old Princess Elizabeth School Building from Ward One to Ward Four but then Mr. De Groot changes his mind

May 1961 – Constable Bohn's salary is increased by \$10 per month

May 1961 – North Kildonan wishes Transcona congratulation on Transcona becoming a city

June 1961 – Stop signs are to be placed on all streets crossing Rothesay.

June 1961 – There are complaints of pigs being kept and running at large on Bonner Avenue

June 1961 – Concrete sidewalks are to be constructed on the north side of Kingsford from Rothesay to De Fehr Street.

June 1961 – The caterpillar operator's salary is raised to \$1.75 per hour.

June 1961 – Jenny Van Hauwermiren of 235 Strood are allowed to keep a horse on her property to the end of 1961.

June 1961 – A triplex is approved for 300 McKay Avenue

June 1961 – House numbers are to be allocated for McLeod Avenue east of Gateway

June 1961 – A commercial building is to be constructed at 1111 and 1113 Henderson Highway.

June 1961 – The Cordite Ditch and Bunn's Creek are to be reconstructed and deepened.

June 1961 – A Municipal employee after 10 years is now entitled to 3 weeks holidays.

July 1961 – A resident suggests that there should be more than one police constable on duty on overnight shifts for safety reasons

July 1961 – A grant of \$250 is given for the dental clinic run by the Kildonan-St Paul Health Unit

July 1961 – Mr. A. A. De Fehr asks to purchase 10 acres of land, east of the C.P.R. tracks (North East Pioneers Greenway) because his present factory at 400 Edison is so overcrowded and his business is increasing

July 1961 – Irving Place is now to be paved from Grandview to a point 225 feet south of Grandview.

August 1961 – Council purchases a 3-ton dump truck from Stern Trucks Limited for \$3627.95.

August 1961 – The Community Chest (United Way) is given permission to conduct its annual campaign

August 1961 – The ditch on the north side of Sutton is to be deepened for a 900 -foot length. River East School Division is to pay \$200.00 towards the cost.

August 1961 – River East Collegiate is to receive a watermain connection to the school at a cost of \$1,850

September 1961 – Council orders the gasoline pumps to be removed from public property in front of Percy's Garage at 1372 Henderson Highway.

September 1961 – Mr. M. R. Gulak President of the trailor park east of Highway 59 receives permission to discharge waste water to the Springfield Road Ditch then through Bunn's Creek into the Red River

September 1961 – Mr. Martin Bergen agrees to pay the full cost in extending the watermain a distance of 50 feet to service his new home on Irving Place

September 1961 – Constable Don Dietz is taken off probation to become a permanent employee

September 1961 – Police Constables in North Kildonan now receive \$315.00 per month.

September 1961 – A large fire occurs at the De Fehr Factory on Edison, both the East Kildonan Fire Department and Winnipeg Fire Department are called to fight the fire beside the North Kildonan Volunteer Fire Department.

September 1961 – North Kildonan enters into a fire protection agreement with the Winnipeg Fire Department.

September 1961 – The East Kildonan Kiwanis Club is given permission to hold its annual apple tag day.

September 1961 – North Kildonan buys a radar set for its police department.

October 1961 – A subdivision is approved for the area north of McKay to the C.P.R. Bergen Cut-off (south side of Springfield Road) west of Macaulay Bay

October 1961 – Council is told that a large company located in Winnipeg is interested in purchasing property in the industrial area east of the C.P.R. tracks (North East Pioneers Greenway) and would employ 300-400 people

October 1961 – Litz Place is to be opened as a public road

October 1961 – A public road is to be opened north and south of McLeod which is to be an extension of Besant

October 1961 – The Firemen's Club on Springfield Road is to be leased to the Boy Scouts and Cubs and occasionally to other worthy organizations

October 1961 – Dr. E. J. Rutledge, the Medical Health Officer for the Kildonan-St Paul Unit is to retire in February 1962. He is to be presented with a gift with North Kildonan's share of the gift is to be \$62.50

October 1961 – A day nursery is approved for 117 Macauley Bay.

November 1961 – The official opening of the completed Springfield Heights School addition is to take place on November 16, 1961

November 1961 – Streetlights are to be erected on Raleigh from Oakland to Springfield Road

November 1961 – A resident of Cheriton claim that several large dogs running at large have bitten children.

November 1961 – The Firemen's Club property on Springfield Road is purchased by North Kildonan for \$3100.00.

November 1961 – Council applies to the provincial government for a snowplowing grant for the same streets as past years except for Sutton which is added because it is a school bus route. The other streets are

November 1961 – It is proposed to extend Rothesay through the Knowles School for Boys property

December 1961 – Bridge and Tank Western Limited purchases property in North Kildonan east of Gateway Road

December 1961 – Christmas turkeys are purchased for all municipal employees and members of council

December 1961 – All purchasers of municipal land in the area east of Gateway now must agree to never oppose any future local improvement levies.

December 1961 – A 25-suite apartment block is approved for 329/331 Edison.

December 1961 – North Kildonan Mayor John Dickson dies suddenly while in office; Councillor M. Whitehead becomes the acting mayor

December 1961 – The Princess Margaret Home and School Association gives up responsibility for the skating rink on the grounds of Princess Margaret School. The North Kildonan Community Club takes over the skating rink

December 1961 – North Kildonan gives a grant of \$500 to the YMCA

December 1961 – The C.N.I.B. is given a grant of \$50

December 1961 – The Ward One Recreational levy of \$1,852.19 is given to the North Kildonan Community Club

December 1961 – A total of \$42,000 in surplus funds are transferred to Building Reserve Account - \$26,000 Land Acquisition Account - \$10,000 Machinery Replacement Account - \$6,000

January 1962 – Councillors Merrill Whitehead, Henry Redekopp, Peter Crook and Leo Rougeau

Councillor Merrill Whitehead is appointed the Acting Mayor until the election of a new mayor

January 1962 – Henderson Highway is now part of the Metro Street System

January 1962 – The Kildonan-St Paul Health Unit dental clinic is given a grant of \$235

January 1962 – The North Kildonan Community Club asks for council's support for a community centre behind Springfield Heights Community Club.

January 1962 – The North Kildonan School Board decides to dispose of Princess Elizabeth School which is on the grounds of Princess Margaret School.

January 1962 – Sewer and water is to be extended to the Bridge and Tank Western property in the area east of Gateway along Vulcan Avenue.

February 1962 – There is a rabies scare in North Kildonan and surrounding rural areas.

February 1962 – Gateway Road is now a Metro Winnipeg Roads

February 1962 – Besant and Vulcan Avenue (Furniture Park) are now officially opened

February 1962 – Harry Wiechert is given permission to operate a two car driving school at 533 Kingsford Avenue for the payment of a \$10 license fee.

February 1962 – North Kildonan Community Club asks for a plot of land 250 feet by 100 feet behind Springfield Heights School for a community centre.

February 1962 – All streets intersecting Henderson Highway are to have stop signs placed on them.

February 1962 – North Kildonan asks for traffic lights at Henderson and Whellams Lane and at Kingsford and Henderson.

March 1962 – Natural gas soon will available for the Litz Subdivision.

March 1962 – Jack L. Pearce is sworn in as mayor of North Kildonan

March 1962 – The clubhouse on Springfield Avenue is to be rented out for one night for a teenage get together for a fee of \$5

March 1962 – Red River Construction Company is given the contract for the installation of sewer and water services on Gateway Road and Vulcan Avenue (Furniture Park) for \$29,901.86

March 1962 – A Chevrolet Biscayne Sedan is purchased as a new police cruiser car for \$2,612

March 1962 – The Victorian Order of Nurses receives a grant of \$150

March 1962 – John Urchenko is declared to be a full Sergeant and not a Patrol Sergeant from the year 1955

March 1962 – Mr. C. Friesen of 1109 Roch Avenue is appointed a Municipal Agent for the collection of water bills for the regular commission of 5 cents per bill

March 1964 – Mr. Don Tymko of 361 Springfield Road is awarded the North Kildonan Parks Board contract for the maintenance of the park sites for \$1,500

March 1964 – Hired as Police Clerks for a six month probationary period at \$165 per month Mr. Robert Thomas Patrick and Mr. Patrick John Robson

March 1964 – The Essar Avenue Playground is to be built on the site of the old Public Works grounds

March 1964 – A kennel license is issued to Mrs. Jessie Norris of 235 Douglas Avenue

March 1964 – The weekly garbage pickup contract is renewed with Kosowan Cartage at 12 cents per weekly pickup. April 1964 – Matt Graham is awarded the 1964 scavenging contract for \$1,200

April 1964 – Councillor Gordon Crozier is appointed to the North Kildonan Parks Board

April 1964 – Mrs. Josephine Badali of 233 Douglas Avenue is issued a kennel license

April 1964 – Metro is asked to locate the inner perimeter road as close to Douglas as possible

May 1964 – Ward Two (area between Springfield Road and Glenway Avenue west of North East Pioneers Greenway) is to become part of Local Improvement District 2

May 1964 – Assistant Secretary-Treasurer Stanley E. Schick is appointed a Justice of the Peace

May 1964 – Mr. Robert Russell is hired on a temporary basis for the Public Works Department

April 1965 – The Municipal Development and Loan Fund of the Province of Manitoba approves sewage and water projects for Local Improvement District 2 with a loan of \$1,191,000

Locks are changed at the Municipal Office and only 4 people are given keys, one councillor, the caretaker and the secretary-treasurer and assistant secretary-treasurer. The Minister of Municipal Affairs is asked to devise new municipal ward boundaries.

May 1968 – The Pound Keeper's salary is raised to \$450 per month

August 1971 – North Kildonan's population is now 17,599. Police Costs work out to \$10.50 per head in North Kildonan.

August 1971 – Council is told that the first phase of the construction of the New Concordia Hospital will begin this winter.

August 1971 – The new indoor arena will be built at a cost of \$315,000.00. The actual cost is \$365,000.00 but the builder Martin Bergen pays \$50,000.00 of the cost himself.

August 1971 – Council asks Transit to extend the bus service from just south of Douglas Avenue to Glenway Avenue

September 1971 – Council is told that the original membership of the Gateway Community Club consisted of 4 members, but it now has 160 members with over 200 children registered in hockey, baseball, baton and gym. The club asks for \$70,000 to \$75,000 for a building and an additional 8.5 acres of land.

The North Kildonan Community Club has less than one acre of land and about \$25,000 in capital expenditures has been spent on the club in 10 years

September 1971 – North Kildonan wins the Willis Trophy Class 2 Division C for the most improved municipal roads under 50 miles by the Manitoba Good Roads Association

September 1971 – A social is planned for all employees of the municipality on December 17 at the Rosewell Community Club. Council gives a grant of \$300 for the event

September 1971 – Sidewalks are to be built on the north side of Springfield Road between Karen and Brian Street and on the south side of Donwood Drive between Claudia Place and the driveway leading to Donwood School.

September 1971 – The fire chief is now to be paid \$815.00 per month and the deputy fire chief \$700.00 per month.

September 1971 – Council is told that Donwood School has 554 students, Maple Leaf School 282 and John Pritchard 745 students.

September 1971 – The salary of the Secretary-Treasurer rises to \$1150.00 per month Assistant Secretary Treasurer - \$775.00 per month Chief Constable - \$1075.00 per month Works Superintendent - \$910.00 per month Water works Foreman - \$790.00 per month

October 1971 – The North Kildonan Community Club is given a grant of \$300 for a banquet to honor the North Kildonan Playground "C" Soccer Club and the North Kildonan Tykes Soccer Team who both won provincial championships

October 1971 – The pathway of Bunn's Creek is to be diverted through the Knowles School Property near Henderson Highway

October 1971 – Some of the firemen patrol the park sites on Halloween.

October 1971 – Council recommends that the New East Kildonan Committee Community that is to come into being on January 1 1972, set aside \$60,000.00 in the 1972 Capital Estimates for a Community Club building at Gateway Park.

November 1971 – The estimated cost of running the River East Arena is \$32,000 per year

November 1971 – The Kildonan County Fair is given a grant of \$755.72 to cover its 1971 loss

December 1971 – Council is told that 2,557 boulevard trees have planted since 1967 to add to the original 1,000 boulevard trees. During 1971, 366 trees were planted as well as 266 replacement trees

December 31 1971 – The last meeting of the North Kildonan is held at 2:20 PM, the meeting is adjourned at 4:00. All members of council are given their identification nameplates; the mayor is also given the gavel. Each councillor, the mayor and secretary-treasurer are given desk pen sets worth \$40 each. North Kildonan is to return all the pictures of the former mayors that were hung in the council chamber to the former mayor or their nearest living relative. All past living mayors are to be presented with a certificate of achievement.

January 1 1972 – Midnight, North Kildonan ceases to exist.
